Amanda Smith, a graduate student at Indiana University Northwest, becomes the first Ford Motor Company intern at the bi-state Association for the Wolf Lake Initiative (AWLI).

Smith, who will serve through 2016, is seeking a Master of Public Affairs degree in the School of Public and Environmental Affairs at IUN. She will become involved in the day-to-day management of the 17-year-old not-for-profit organization and land trust.

In September, she will supervise three new Ford Motor Company interns to be hired by AWLI.

Smith received her undergraduate degree at Manchester University, North Manchester, Indiana, and also studied at the University of Gloucestershire, Cheltenham, England.

Prior to joining AWLI, Smith was a hiring coach at CREngland at Burns Harbor, IN. She also served as a library technician at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii and as a senior field instructor at Second Nature Entrada at Santa Clara, Utah.

Smith resides in Valparaiso.
