## Immediate Release

The 14th annual Active Living Faire at Wolf Lake on Saturday, Sept. 30, will feature a Bike-athon

and a Walk-a-thon to raise funds for non-profit organizations. Interested organizations can partner with the Association for the Wolf Lake Initiative (AWLI), the sponsor of the Faire, and have their members raise money by having friends, family and local businesses sponsor them.

Organizations must submit a registration form for either event by Sept. 15. AWLI's registration fee will be 10 percent of the money collected.

The Bike-a-thon will follow a 10-mile course. AWLI requires all participants of the Bike-a-thon to wear helmets.

The Walk-a-thon will be an 8K, or five miles.

The Active Living Faire is organized to promote health and fitness and also promote the Wolf Lake watershed. It is free to the public.

It will begin at 9 a.m. on Sept. 30 at the Environmental Education Center, 2405 Calumet Ave., Hammond. In the afternoon it will be held from 1:30-4 p.m. near Shelter 2, William Powers State Fish and Wildlife Area, 126th Place and Avenue O, Chicago.

Activities will include a poster contest based on a walk highlighting nature, a hike to view autumn colors along Wolf Lake, a discussion about Indian Creek and Hyde Lake Wetland and a preview of the Wolf Lake Watershed Advisory Committee meeting on Nov. 3.
