## Immediate Release

The 15th annual Active Living Faire at Wolf Lake moves up to Labor Day this year, but still features a combined bike ride and bike-a-thon in the morning and a nature walk and walk-a-thon in the afternoon.

The 20-mile bike ride, with frequent stops along the way, will begin with an 8:30 a.m. sign up at the Environmental Education Center, 2405 Calumet Ave., Hammond. In the afternoon, the nature walk and walk-a-thon will be held at William W. Powers State Recreation Area, 126th Place and Avenue O, Chicago.

Sign up will be at 2 p.m. at the visitors' center and the walk will follow the traditional five-mile course.

Sponsored by the Association for the Wolf Lake Initiative (AWLI), both the bike-a-thon and walk-a-thon will allow non-profit groups and individuals to raise funds for a special cause. Participants will learn about all parts of the watershed, while viewing early autumn colors.

Registration deadline for the Bike-a-Thon and Walk-a-Thon is July 27. Deadline for Labor Day Bike Ride and Nature Walk is August 24.
